Mercy Community Crisis Pregnancy Center Statement of Principle

To accomplish its purpose, Mercy Community Crisis Pregnancy Center shall operate by the following principles:

1. Mercy Community Crisis Pregnancy Center is an outreach ministry of Jesus Christ through His Church. Therefore, Mercy Community Crisis Pregnancy Center is committed to presenting the gospel of our Lord to those involved with crisis pregnancies both in word and deed. Those who labor at Mercy Community Crisis Pregnancy Center must know Christ as their Savior and Lord.
2. Mercy CCPC is committed to providing its clients with accurate and complete information about fetal development, abortion, abortion alternatives, sexually transmitted diseases and the benefits of sexual abstinence until marriage.
3. Mercy CCPC is committed to integrity in dealing with clients by earning their trust and providing accurate information and services. Mercy Community Crisis Pregnancy Center denounces any form of deception in its corporate advertising or individual conversations with its clients.
4. Mercy CCPC is committed to assisting women throughout their pregnancies and thereafter by providing emotional support and practical assistance, which typically cannot be obtained through other agencies.
5. Mercy CCPC shall not discriminate in providing services because of race, creed, color, national origin, age, or marital status of its clients. Each client is recognized as a worthy person and will continue to receive support from Mercy CCPC regardless of the decision she has made.
6. Mercy CCPC never advises, provides, or refers, for abortion or abortifacients.
7. Mercy CCPC offers services free of charge at all times.
8. Mercy CCPC is committed to creating awareness within the local community of the needs of pregnant women in crisis pregnancies and of the fact that abortion only compounds human need rather than resolving it.
9. Mercy CCPC promotes abstinence until marriage for unmarried individuals and does not recommend or refer for contraceptives or contraceptive services. Married individuals seeking contraceptive information will be urged to seek counsel, along with their spouses, from their pastor and physician.
10. Mercy CCPC recognizes the validity of adoption as one alternative to abortion, but is not biased toward adoption when compared to the other life-saving alternative. Mercy CCPC is independent of any adoption agencies, relating to them in the same manner as to other helpful referral sources. Mercy CCPC receives no payment of any kind from these agencies, does not enter into contractual relationships with them, and does not share combined office space. Adoption agencies are not established under the auspices of centers. Mercy CCPC will not establish an adoption agency. Mercy CCPC will neither initiate nor facilitate independent adoptions.
11. Mercy CCPC is committed to promoting the biblical standard of chastity, expressed as abstinence of the unmarried persons. The biblical definition of marriage is between one man and one woman. The fidelity of married persons is the only viable lifestyle.
